Sheila A. Davis - Sheila is a native of Brooklyn, NY. A product of the New York City Public School System and is a graduate of Franklin K. Lane High School.

Hoffman Uniform Co., U.S. Post Office, New York Telephone Co., Social Services Food Stamp Program, and the New York City Transit Authority. In January 2007, after 28 years of service, Sheila retired from the Transit Authority.

Always having an entrepreneurial desire, Sheila has completed courses in the Travel Industry, Preparing Taxes and Real Estate. She has spent the last 23 years promoting health and wellness as a Director with Neo-Life.

Sheila works diligently with various religious organizations. Current President of Church Women United, Brooklyn Unit, Eastern Baptist Association – Women's Department, Gospel Music Workshop of America, Hampton University Ministers Conference Choir.
